#### **Background/Discussion**

The James Vincent Group prepares the monthly financial reports. The District's annual budget, which is adopted by the Board each June for the following fiscal year (July 1 – June 30), is formatted to mirror the monthly financial statements. The financial reports provide the Board with a monthly recap of expenditures and revenues, along with year-to-date account balance information.

In compliance with A.R.S. §48-807(O), the following reports have been added to the monthly financial statements packet:

1. Cash Flow – All Governmental Funds.

The Cash Flow report consists of the combined cash balances of all District Funds. These balances include the General (100), Transport Services (150), Capital Projects (200), Special Revenue (400), Debt Principal (500), and Debt Interest (600) Funds. The Cash Flow report is updated monthly with the actual revenues deposited into and actual expenditures disbursed from the District's cash accounts. It is important to note the revenues and expenditures are reported on a Cash Basis. This report is generated to demonstrate that the fire District maintains sufficient cash available to satisfy the projected expenditures budgeted over the course of the fiscal year.

2. Fund Account Bank Reconciliations.

The reconciliation of each of the District's Fund Cash Accounts (General (100), Transport Services (150), Capital Projects (200), Special Revenue (400), Debt Principal (500), and Debt Interest (600) Funds) between the Pinal County Treasurer's monthly bank statement and the District's Fund balance sheet report is provided. To signify Board approval of the monthly financial statements and bank reconciliations, the Board Chairman is requested to sign the attached Letter of Acceptance which will be kept on file at the District.

## B. 7710 Insurance Renewal - Term 1/1/2024 – 12/31/2025

### **Background/Discussion**

On December 31, 2023, the District's worker's compensation policy with 7710 is set to expire. The 2024 renewal quote of \$416,925 reflects a 37% INCREASE over 2023's premium rates.

The most important aspects of the 2023 workers' compensation renewal quote include:

- Presumptive cancer provisions in S1451 passed by the AZ legislature, 7710 mandates that all public safety employees, regardless of rank, be included in the 7710 rate class.
- The District's Experience Modifier (EMOD) has increased to **1.160** from 0.76.

This Medical Staffing Agreement represents Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to be provided for The Lost Dutchman Marathon special event on Sunday, February 18, 2024. This is a joint agreement between The Lost Dutchman Marathon/ City of Apache Junction and the Superstition Fire & Medical District. The District agrees to provide EMS services for the Marathon on a no-cost basis, which is valid only for the event scheduled to occur on February 18, 2024. This agreement provides for Emergency Medical Technicians/Paramedics to staff medical aid posts and or to serve as roving medical aid services per the direction of the Marathon and as required by the Pinal County Special Event Application.

The District agrees to provide the following in the execution of this agreement:

- Provide one (1) District apparatus (Adaptive Response Vehicle) staffed with two personnel: certified as paramedic or EMT providers, a complement of basic life support equipment, and an automated external defibrillator (AED). This crew/apparatus will have the ability to be mobile or to stage at a location(s) to be determined by the Marathon Staff.
- Provide one (1) District Transport Capable Rescue Unit / Ambulance with two personnel; one (1) paramedic (advanced) provider and one (1) EMT (basic) provider, and a full complement of advanced life support equipment as required by the State of Arizona for the provision of advanced life support EMS. This unit will be staged at and dedicated to the designated finish line area for the duration of the event.

### Re: 2024 Native American Arts Festival; Medical Staffing Agreement

Dave McElligott,

This Medical Staffing Agreement represents the cost associated with providing Emergency Medical Services (EMS) to staff a Medical Aid Station for the Native American Arts Festival on January 20 & 21, 2024. This is a joint agreement between the Superstition Mountain Museum and the Superstition Fire & Medical District and is only valid for the scheduled event of January 20 & 21, 2024. This agreement provides for one EMT Basic provider and one Paramedic Advanced provider to serve as medical aid services as required by the Pinal County Special Event Permit.

Both parties agree upon the following obligations as per the execution of this agreement for services:

### Fire District's Obligations:

- Provide one (1) State Certified Paramedic, advanced level provider, and one (1) State Certified EMT, basic level provider, to staff a medical aid station at the special event located at 4087 N. Apache Trail, Apache Junction, AZ 85119 on Saturday & Sunday, January 20 & 21, 2024 from the hours of 9:00 am until 4:00 pm.
- 2. Provide all necessary advanced life support equipment required for Paramedic level care.
- 3. Provide all necessary disposable medical supplies.
- 4. Provide communications equipment for contact with Mesa Regional Dispatch Center for requesting additional resources for the treatment or transport of patients at the event.

5. Provide for the disposal of medical waste or other biohazard materials generated by the treatment of patients at the event.

#### **Superstition Mountain Museum Obligations**:

- Agree to payment for services of one (1) State Certified Paramedic provider and one (1) State Certified EMT provider to staff a medical aid station at the special event located at 4087 N. Apache Trail, Apache Junction, AZ 85119 on Saturday, January 20, 2024, & Sunday, January 21, 2024, from the hours of 8:00 am until 4:30 pm (8.5 hours total per provider) per <u>Schedule</u> <u>'A'</u> (attached).
- 2. Provide a secure and centralized location for the staging of an Emergency Vehicle. This location shall have direct access in and out of the festival grounds to avoid any delays in the transportation of patients or response of additional emergency vehicles.
- 3. Signage to identify the medical aid service's location.
- 4. Provide radio equipment to facilitate communications between the medical aid station staff, the event security staff, and the event coordinators throughout the duration of the event.
- 5. Provide unobstructed access at all times for emergency vehicle traffic into the event.
- 6. Hand washing station equipped with water and hand soap/sanitizer located within the medical aid station.

### **Miscellaneous Provisions:**

- 1. <u>Indemnification</u>: To the fullest extent permitted by law, Superstition Mountain Museum shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless the Fire District, its agents, representatives, officers, directors, officials, and employees from and against all claims, damages, losses, and expenses, including, but not limited to, attorney fees, court costs, expert witness fees, and the cost of appellate proceedings, relating to, arising out of, or alleged to have resulted from the negligent acts, errors, omissions, mistakes or malfeasance relating to the performance of this Agreement by the Superstition Mountain Museum, as well as any person or entity for whose acts, errors, omissions, mistakes or malfeasance the Superstition Mountain Museum may be legally liable. Nothing herein shall be construed to modify the gross negligence standard in A.R.S. § 48-818.
- 2. <u>Non-appropriation</u>: This Agreement shall be subject to available funding for the Fire District, and nothing in this Agreement shall bind the Fire District to expenditures in excess of funds appropriated and allotted for the purposes outlined in this Agreement.

If parties agree upon all conditions and obligations, the Fire District and Superstition Mountain Museum, this document and representative(s) signature(s) shall be considered and accepted as a binding agreement. Affixed signatures and receipt of payment must be received in advance of the scheduled event date at our administration office located at 575 N. Idaho Rd, Apache Junction, AZ, 85119, for this agreement to remain valid.

Pursuant to A.R.S. Section 38-511, the Fire District may terminate this Agreement.
